During the early centuries of the Church's life there was a great concern for defining the orthodox faith of the Church. Such a need arose because of controversies developing within the Christian Church. For example, questions about the relationship of Jesus to God the Father, about whether God could suffer, and about the way the Holy Spirit worked in people's lives, had led different Christians to different conclusions.

So, at particular times in the history of the Church certain statements of Christian belief (creeds) emerged.

The two most important of these are the Nicene Creed (from the fourth century A.D.) and the Apostles' Creed (which is more difficult to date but

You may ask what has led me to think about creeds. Well, we are in the year 2025 which marks the 1700<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Council of Nicaea (from which the Nicene Creed owes its origin). So, I thought that I could challenge you to reflect upon your own beliefs, as we approach Holy Week and Easter, and then to write your own creed. If you do so, you might like to seek out someone else who has done the same and share your creeds with each other. I wonder how similar or different they might be.

The seven current members of the Worship Group (guitars, keys, bass, violin and singers) lead the congregation in worship most Sunday mornings, and occasionally at a Sunday evening service for special events such as Harvest, Christmas, Easter etc.


We meet at church to practice almost every week on a Friday afternoon, usually having liaised earlier in the week, with whoever is preaching, and to offer song/hymn choices according to their theme. We know there are loads of talented musicians and singers, of all ages in Bents Green. So, if you have a heart for service through worship and think you could help us, do please speak with any one of us, or pop into one of our practices on Fridays at 2.00.

Worship is a priority in the church. The band's focus is not about being musically skilled or proficient, or hugely enthusiastic for the songs and their message (although we try!) but it is ALL about our service. Yes, to do our best to glorify God, we do need to practice and prepare, to listen to soundtracks, to study the scriptures behind the songs, to discuss and plan, and to pray together. But like every member of the congregation, our first responsibility is to come to give to God, to minister to God with our worship, and to give Him the praise and glory of which He is so worthy. Our worship is a response to the greatness and grace of God, and we must try to do it no matter what else is happening in our lives. We come as we are, to worship Him, and he clothes us in the dazzling robes of Christ's righteousness – (In royal robes I don't deserve – as the song goes) - and he reaches out His hand to draw us into the celebrations. The scriptures tell us that 'He will rejoice over us singing' and that 'God delights in our praises'. We are humbled and greatly blessed to be able to serve Him.

A group of experienced volunteers formed Sunrise 2 years ago after the sad loss of 2 local PreSchools. Sadly yet another has closed this year, so we continue to provide space for PreSchool aged children to develop, grow and meet new friends for school.

We provide a relaxed caring environment where parents, carers and Grandparents can make lovely memories with their children and build community. This year we have also become supported by Sheffield Family Hubs, see our article about this for more detail.

Our weekly theme inspires free play, craft activities, messy trays, snack craft, gross motor equipment, role play. We have stories, songs and our Sunrise mascot Sunny loves to join the fun. This spring/summer we will be developing our outdoor area thanks to



#### **Sparklers**

We are a group for 2-4 year old to meet together on a Sunday morning to learn about the Bible and how we can follow Jesus. We start with a show and tell time where the children tell us any news and what they have been doing in the past week. The morning has a basic structure but this can alter depending on the mix and age of the children that morning. During the morning we have a Bible story, do a craft linked to the story, play

games and have a prayer time.

The children are ways keen to come and learn and enjoy caring and sharing with each other.

#### **Sparks**

Sparks is a group for 6 to 11 year old which meets every Sunday 10.30 -12 pm. We offer games, find out about Jesus through bible stories, crafts and friendship.

#### Games, Craft and Chatter

The group meets weekly on a Wednesday from 12.30 to 3.00pm and is a Welcome Place registered with Age UK Sheffield

Welcome Space providers in SW Sheffield.

We take part in a variety of activities which include knitting, crocheting, jigsaws, sewing, jewellery making, games and of course chatting!

Some people bring their own crafts to do in the group while others knit, sew or crochet items for charity. We have made knee blankets and fiddle mats for care homes, and scarves, hats and gloves for Link for Hope shoeboxes.

Last Christmas group members, church members and members of the Girls Brigade

hung 1500 angels all around the community. Each had a Christmas prayer and a note saying they were free to take. These had been knitted or crocheted by group members over the previous 18 months

We have 35 on the register ranging in age from 15 (who come in school holidays) to early 90's and a average attendance is about 24. Lots of friendships have been made that carry on outside of a Wednesday afternoon. We always stop for a short meditation during the afternoon and can offer individual prayer if asked for.

#### Children's Christmas Choir

The choir is made up of around 20 children and teenagers and is open to anyone aged between 5 and 18. We usually split into two groups by age each group learns one song plus all the children learn a second song which both groups sing together. The choir performs as part of the traditional Carol Service and on Christmas Eve as part of the Christingle Service. Every child who wants to can sing one line by themselves into a microphone as a solo, as well as singing sections all together as a group.

The choir usually practices for an hour a week during most weeks from October to December. Practices take place on either a Sunday tea time or Saturday afternoon or evening (times chosen to fit around the Church pantomime practices).

Lighthouse is an after school club which runs on Wednesdays in term time from 3:30-5:30pm. Lighthouse is a afterschool club designed for children aged 5-11 years old. The cost is £2 per child, per session and this includes a drink, snacks and craft materials. Each half term we look at different bible stories and themes. Each week we offer a different bible story, craft, snack, drama, games and activities. This half term we are looking at the Easter story and will be making lots of Easter themed crafts. We are a group of ladies who meet on Thursday mornings during term time in the upstairs lounge at church, 10.30 - 12.15ish.

It's a very relaxed, friendly and welcoming group where you can come and go to fit in to suit.

We have on average, 30 parents, grandparents and carers attending every week during term time and 40 babies and toddlers. My own granddaughter comes now which is wonderful! I've been running Sunbeams for ten years now and it continues to be an enormous privilege to do so.

Every week we have a wide range of toys and play areas set out. We have a story that fits with our theme and a craft to do after that links in. We have a snack time while the children are listening and this is always well received! We always finish with singing and playing of musical instruments which the children love and don't seem to mind that I absolutely can't sing!! Haha!

Refreshments are served throughout by my wonderful team, my mum, my mum in law and sometimes even my dad! It's a family affair! And I couldn't do it without them.

Every year we participate in Christian Aid's Big Breakfast, offering delicious food and all proceeds and donations on the day going to Christian Aid. We also have performed a nativity in the church for the last two years at the Wednesday morning service. I am always so proud of this group of little 0-4 year olds who confidently stand at the front and 'perform'. It has been very well received by the congregation and all those who come along to support.

Sunbeams provides not only a place for grown ups and their children to meet, make friends, have fun and enjoy a cuppa! It also is a great platform to introduce everyone to our church and all the amazing things we offer here. I am constantly told of how comfortable people feel here, what a welcoming place this is and how lovely folk are. These days, we have returned to our Girls Brigade roots, and just have children and young people taking part, 60 of them, aged 4 to 18.

#### Weekly Art classes at Bents Green

Local Artist Celia Bennett has been running weekly art classes for adults at Bents Green since June 2024.

The 3 x Wednesday classes have proved so popular that Celia has now added an additional class on Tuesday evenings. The classes are run and relaxed in an encouraging and supportive environment.

There are 3 mixed media classes, which vary from week to week from acrylics to watercolour or pastels, and sometimes drawing with pencils or charcoal.

Tuesday evening 6.30 - 9pm Wednesday morning 10am till 12.30 Wednesday evening 6.30 - 9pm



The mixed media classes are £20 each, payable in advance for each 5 or 6 week term.

There's also a watercolour class on Wednesday afternoon from 12.45 till 2.45pm, which costs £15 per class, payable in advance each term. Students provide their own watercolour and acrylic paints, paper and bushes.

The groups are mixed abilities from beginners through to very experienced artists. Ceia works step by step and gives lots of individual support. The age range is very mixed from circa 20 right through to some students who are now retired and finally have time to unleash their inner artist at last! Currently, the Wednesday morning and evening class are full, but you can request to be put on the waiting list in case a place comes up.

#### **LEADERSHIP AT BENTS GREEN**

The Church Council takes the big decisions at Bents Green. It meets three times a year, makes appointments, receives reports and makes sure that all is in order regarding money, the buildings, safeguarding, worship, pastoral care etc.

Our minster Philip chairs the Council. It has 15 members, representing the varied aspects of the life of the Church. Members and friends of the Church are welcome to suggest matters for consideration, and to attend meetings as observers.

The Leadership Team supports the Council. It has 8 members, and meets about six times a year. It decides lots of practical things, such as what we do at Christmas and Easter, the date of the Fun Day etc. It also gives fuller consideration to topics that go to the Council for decision. A good example is our Mission Action Plan, (below) which embraces the main aspects of Church life, and which the Council updated in November 2024. A copy is on the Noticeboard in the corridor. It defines our purpose as being - 'A community church sharing the love and light of Jesus'.

The members of the Leadership Team are Cherry, Christele, Daphne, Jonathan, Katie, Pete, Philip and John. We like to take turns to chair and take the notes.
